



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
between
Kaplan University and The Community College of Baltimore County

PURPOSE

The purpose of this articulation agreement is to establish procedures and guidelines for students to transfer to a Kaplan University (KU) degree program following completion of an associate's degree program at The Community College of Baltimore County, of Baltimore County, MD (CCBC). With respect to courses of study that lead to an associate's degrees at CCBC, both KU and CCBC will facilitate the transfer of associate degree graduates to baccalaureate completion programs at KU. This advanced start baccalaureate program (also known as a "2+2 option") is designed to maximize a student's transfer credit award.

Admission to KU

1. CCBC students in good standing and eligible graduates will be reviewed as pre-qualified applicants for KU degree programs. Applicants will be required to complete all KU admissions requirements in force at the time of application. KU admissions requirements are detailed in its most recent catalog in effect.
2. To be eligible for application to an advanced start bachelor's program, a student must be an associate degree graduate or must submit a letter from CCBC's Registrar indicating that the student is in good standing, the expected date of graduation, the associate's degree expected to be earned, and the program/major. Upon graduation, the student must submit proof of having been awarded an associate's degree.
3. Upon acceptance and signing of the KU enrollment agreement, transfer students will be subject to all KU policies, codes of conduct, KU procedures, and requirements. These are described in the most recent KU catalog.

Credit Transferability

4. Students having completed certificate and diploma programs will be eligible for a course-by-course review for transfer of credits to KU. Students having completed an associate's degree program (AA, AAS, AS, AFA, AAT or specialized associate degrees) consisting of a minimum of 90 quarter credits (or the equivalent) will be eligible for a block transfer of up to 90 quarter credits and acceptance into KU's "advanced start" baccalaureate option.
5. KU will complete a course-by-course review of all transfer credits submitted on official transcripts from CCBC. A Prior Learning Assessment Curriculum Evaluation (PLACE) may be developed to aid in the transfer credit evaluation process. KU reserves the right to make a final determination on all matters related to transferability and course equivalencies.
6. CCBC students who are unable to fulfill KU prerequisites at CCBC must complete them at KU. Prerequisites are listed in KU current catalog and vary based on the bachelor's degree program and emphasis chosen.

7. CCBC students must fulfill KU requirements, which entail completion of no less than 25-percent of their program requirements at KU, including a minimum of 50-percent of the major requirements, including the capstone course, at KU. Credit earned through any combination of Transfer Credit, Challenge Credit or Experiential Credit will not exceed 75-percent of total credits required for graduation.

Discounts and Scholarships!

Because of this agreement to articulate, KU will extend professional courtesy discounts to CCBC alumni and employees concomitant with the date of the fully executed document.

8. **CCBC alumni and employees will receive a ten percent discount on their KU tuition.** CCBC alumni and employees must inform KU admissions directors about their affiliation to receive their discount;
9. KU will extend to CCBC alumni and employees all of its online certificates, undergraduate, and graduate programs, as and when offered;
