What is a partnership?

- A relationship between individuals or groups that is characterized by mutual cooperation and responsibility, as for the achievement of a specified goal.
- The benefits of an articulated partnership:
 - the seamless transfer of students between institutions
 - the development of faculty and staff relationships
 - academic and social agreements

Ingredients:

Articulation Agreements
Memorandum of Understanding
Dual Admission Program

- **Benefits:**
 - Defined transfer curriculum
 - Seamless transfer
 - Academic advising
 - Scholarships
 - Admission/Enrollment
 - Recruitment

Recipe:

- Include the following in an articulation agreement: administrative policies, number of credits that will transfer, CCBC curriculum, 4year curriculum, signatures
- Try to blend the articulation agreement into a 2 year degree program
- Completion of the AA/AS/AAS degree is important
- Think about General Education requirements as well as program requirements
- If possible, include the agreement in ARTSYS as part of the Recommended Transfer Program

Recipe, Continued:

- Admissions information
- Financial Aid/Scholarship information
- Data sharing
- Honors Program
- Faculty workload
- Advertising/Publicity
