Employers in the Baltimore area are anxiously recruiting new graduates. CCBC can help you, including partial scholarships for credit and non-credit courses.

Health care is the nation's largest industry and predictions show that it will continue as a high growth/high demand industry for the foreseeable future. The U.S. Department of Labor awarded CCBC and its partners a Community-Based Job Training Grant to help reduce shortages in three high-demand health practice areas. The grant supports students interested in the following programs:

Medical Laboratory

- **Clinical Lab Assistant certificate course:** cost - \$700; takes approx. 3 months (Contact Lane Miller, Workforce Development coordinator; 410.780.6205; lmiller2@ccbcmd.edu)
- **Medical Lab Technician credit program:** cost - \$3700; takes 3 semesters after prerequisites (Contact Candice Grayson, MLT program director; 410.918.4029; cgrayson@ccbcmd.edu)

Dental

- **Dental Assistant certificate course:** cost - \$2,300; takes approx. 3 months
- **Dental Hygiene credit program:** cost - \$10,700; takes 5 semesters after prerequisites (Contact Kathleen D'Ambrisi, program director; 410.780.6759; kdambrisi@ccbcmd.edu)

Nursing and Patient Care

- **Certified Nursing Assistant course:** cost - \$1040; takes approx. 3 months (Contact Betsy Eisbart, program specialist; 410.780.6655; beisbart@ccbcmd.edu)
- **Nursing Support Technician course:** cost - \$1085; takes approx. 3 months after prerequisites (including being a CNA in good standing) (Contact Pat Brown, Nurse coordinator; 410.780.6752; pbrown@ccbcmd.edu)
