Description

Cooperative Education: Chemical Dependency Counseling

Provides opportunity to earn academic credit while exploring the field of chemical dependency counseling. Note: This experience does not serve in the place of a CMDP Internship. Work experience to be arranged by CMDP Program Coordinator. Students must have a signed co-op application from the Office of Experiential Learning. 181-1, 182-2 and 183-3 Semester Hours.

Prerequisites: Consent of the Program Director or the Academic Dean.

Overall Course Objectives.

A minimum of 10 learning outcomes will be established collaboratively by the student, field supervisor, and faculty coordinator.

Major Topics

To be determined on an individual student basis.

Course Requirements

Establishment and completion of a minimum of 10 learning outcomes.

At least one student evaluation to be completed by the field supervisor.

Documentation of appropriate number of field hours, signed by field supervisor.

Academic project to be determined by the faculty coordinator.
