Description

EMT Intermediate Special Populations

Introduces special techniques of assessment and prehospital management of patients presenting with obstetrical emergencies; discusses neonatal, pediatric, and geriatric emergencies.

Prerequisites: EMST 211.

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

1. Describe causes, complications, signs and symptoms, and prehospital management of patients with a variety of Obstetrical Emergencies.
2. Describe causes, complications, signs and symptoms, and prehospital management of patients with a variety of Neonatal Emergencies.
3. Describe causes, complications, signs and symptoms, and prehospital management of patients with a variety of Pediatric Emergencies.
4. Describe causes, complications, signs and symptoms, and prehospital management of patients with a variety of Geriatric Emergencies.
5. Describe the prehospital assessment and management of patients with selected Obstetrical, Gynecological, Neonatal, Pediatric, and Geriatric emergencies as relates to the Maryland Medical Protocols for Emergency Medical Services Providers.

Students registered for EMST 212 must maintain advanced life support affiliation with a Maryland volunteer, career, or commercial ambulance company at all times while enrolled in the CCBC Essex EMT Program.
