Description

EMT Intermediate Assessment Based Management

Applies understanding and knowledge of patient assessment and prehospital management of medical and trauma emergencies; provides interactive, scenario-based environment.
Prerequisites: EMST 105, EMST 110, EMST 210, EMST 211, EMST 212.

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

1. Discuss how assessment based management contributes to effective patient and scene management.
2. Describe factors that affect assessment and decision making in the prehospital setting.
3. Outline effective techniques for scene and patient assessment choreography.
4. Identify essential take-in equipment for general and selected patient situations.
5. Outline strategies for patient approach that promote an effective patient encounter.
6. Describe techniques to permit efficient and accurate presentations of the patient.

Advanced Patient Assessment

Course Requirements

Students registered for EMST 213 must maintain advanced life support affiliation with a Maryland volunteer, career, or commercial ambulance company at all times while enrolled in the CCBC Essex EMT Program.

Mastery level for all written examinations is 75%.

Successful completion of this course, in combination with EMST 105, 110, 210, 211, 212, 214, and 215 is required for the student to be eligible to sit for the National Registry of EMT's Intermediate examinations and/or the Maryland Cardiac Rescue Technician examination.
