Description

EMT Intermediate Clinical Practice

Applies knowledge of emergency and non-emergency advanced life support assessment and management; provides direct supervision of a preceptor/mentor in both the prehospital field environment and a hospital emergency department.

Prerequisites: EMST 105, EMST 110, EMST 210, EMST 211, EMST 212, EMST 213.

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

1. Gather, evaluates, and synthesizes information.
2. Makes appropriate decisions based on the information.
3. Takes appropriate actions required for patient care.

Precepted/Mentored Clinical Experience

Course Requirements

Students registered for EMST 214 must maintain advanced life support affiliation with a Maryland volunteer, career, or commercial ambulance company at all times while enrolled in the CCBC Essex EMT Program.

Mastery level for all written examinations is 75%.

Other Course Information

This course is offered during the Spring only.

Successful completion of this course, in combination with EMST 105, 110, 210, 211, 212, 213, and 215 is required for the student to be eligible to sit for the National Registry of EMT's Intermediate examinations and/or the Maryland Cardiac Rescue Technician examination.
