Description

Clinical rotations in a variety of settings designed to develop clinical proficiency and interpersonal skills for the Paramedic.

Prerequisites: Admission to the EMT-P Program.

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

1. Apply the cognitive, psychomotor, and affective objectives for all course material mastered to this point in a variety of in-hospital and prehospital settings, including: emergency departments, intensive and critical care units, step-down units, operating rooms, psychiatric facilities, burn trauma centers, neurotrauma centers, critical care transport units, and public service emergency medical services units.

Trauma and Shock Management
Management of Medical Emergencies, including:

Infectious Disease, Environmental, Geriatric, and Pediatric
Obstetrical and Neonatal Emergencies
Behavioral Emergencies

Course Requirements

Students registered for EMST 273 must maintain advanced life support affiliation with a Maryland volunteer, career, or commercial ambulance company at all times while enrolled in the CCBC Essex EMT Program.

Mastery level for all written examinations is 75%.

Other Course Information

This course is offered during the Spring only.

Successful completion of this course, in combination with EMST 252, EMST 254, EMST 256, EMST 257 and EMST 259 is required for the student to be eligible to sit for the National Registry of EMT-Paramedic examinations.
