Course Description

ESOL Individualized Laboratory

Provides a series of optional, individualized laboratories for students enrolled in ESOL 046, 047, 051 or 052; examines the reading, speaking, listening, and writing skills covered in the respective ESOL class in an individualized learning environment

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course student will be able to:

1. Develop an individualized ESOL learning plan with clear language learning goals.
2. Monitor progress (in consultation with instructor) towards learning goals.
3. Assess own learning using self-assessment reports.
4. Use multimedia technology (audio and video equipment, computers) to learn English.
5. Understand oral English at the level covered in their respective ESOL class.
6. Understand written English at the level covered in their respective ESOL class.
7. Speak and pronounce English at the level covered in their respective ESOL class.
8. Write English at the level covered in their respective ESOL class.
9. Acquire and utilize new vocabulary associated with topics covered in the lab class.
10. Demonstrate mastery of grammar covered according to the students individualized learning plan.

Major Topics

1. Use of multimedia technology for language learning
2. Student goal setting and self assessment
3. Self-regulatory learning strategies
4. Grammar topics based on individual student needs
5. Reading comprehension
6. Listening comprehension
7. Writing skills
8. Speaking skills
9. Vocabulary

Course Requirements

Grading/exams: Grading procedures will be determined by the individual faculty members but will include the following:

1. Students must receive an overall average of 70% in order to receive a grade of “S” for the course.
2. Students must consistently participate in class and use lab resources.
3. Students must establish (in conjunction with instructor) and use an individualized learning plan.
4. Students must complete self-assessments and participate in assessment dialogues with instructor.
5. Students must complete all exams, quizzes, class work and homework assignments given by instructor.
6. Students are expected to attend all class sessions.
