Description

Primary Care Preceptorship

Provides an eight-week final clinical experience; enables the student to apply principles of the practice of medicine covered throughout the program in a primary care or rural/ underserved location; allows the student to function as a full member of the medical team and be responsible for patient care from presentation through follow-up including diagnostic evaluation and patient management.
