Description

Intermediate Golf

Develops and refines intermediate golf techniques and strategies. Emphasizes mastery of special shots, such as the pitch, chip and run, sand, side hill and up and down hill lies; enhances knowledge of basic terms, rules, course etiquette, the purchasing of equipment, tournaments, and handicapping. A fee is charged.

Overall Course Objectives

- Describe the fundamental concepts of the basic golf swing.
- Describe the concepts of golf specialty shots (i.e., pitch, chip and run, lob, sand, etc.).
- Demonstrate the drive and use of fairway woods.
- Demonstrate a fully coordinated swing with the irons.
- Demonstrate the specialty shots.
- Demonstrate the putting shots.
- Define golf terms, rules and course etiquette.
- Explain the scoring concept.
- Explain the handicapping concept.
- Explain various types of golf competitions (i.e., match vs. metal).
- Identify key points in equipment selection.

Major Topics

1. Rules of Golf – United States Golf Association
2. History and etiquette of golf
3. Scoring principles
4. Equipment
5. Tournament principles
6. Intermediate golf skills

Course Requirements

Specific assignments and procedures for evaluating student performance in this course will be described in the individual class syllabus, but will include the following:

1. Written examination
2. Skill Proficiency examination
