Description

Clinical Seminar III

Radiography III

Concludes the Radiography sequence with the ninth course in the professional portion of the curriculum; consists of both classroom and clinical sessions. Provides comprehensive review sessions and study in preparation for the ARRT certification examination in radiography; gives continued practice in clinical skills through participation in the procedures performed in a radiology/imaging department.

Ten (10) lecture hours, twenty-four (24) laboratory hours a week, five weeks. (Offered Summer).

Prerequisite: RADT 203

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of the Registry Review module, the student will be able to:

1. Assess his/her strengths and weakness through completion of simulated registry examinations.
2. Prepare for the registry examination through concentrated study and review of registry exam specifications.

Upon completion of Clinical Education, the student will be able to:

1. Complete all remaining final comprehensive laboratory evaluations.
2. Present any remaining films for image evaluation.
3. Complete all remaining competency tests.
4. Complete area-specific performance objectives for scheduled RADT 222 clinical areas and any incomplete performance objectives from previous RADT courses.
5. Demonstrate appropriate professional behavior while on clinical duty.

Major Topics

The didactic portion of RADT 222 consists of comprehensive review sessions and study in preparation for the ARRT certification examination in Radiography. Simulated registry exams are administered weekly to assess student progress.

Course Requirements

Grades for RADT 222 will be determined by the following:

- I. Attendance, Dress Code & Ethics 2.5 points
Minus 0.5 points for each absence or late, minus 1.0 point for a "NO-CALL"
Absence from three (3) or more classes or three (3) or more absences from clinical will lower the course grade one letter unless accompanied by a physician's written reason.
Minus 0.5 for each infraction of uniform policy, minus 1.0 for each infraction after 1st notice
Students must be appropriately attired to be permitted in the clinical area.
 - II. Clinical Performance Objectives and Exam Record Sheets 7.5 points
 - III. Clinical Evaluations 15 points
Evaluations of students' clinical performance are completed weekly by supervising clinical staff.
 - IV. Laboratory Evaluations (simulations), Image Evaluations, and Clinical Competencies 15 points
 - V. Review Tests/Quizzes 20 points
 - VI. Simulated Registry Examinations 40 points
- 100 points

The ARRT has established a minimum passing scaled score of 75%. The radiography program has established standards that are consistent with grading scales of other radiography programs. Letter grades for RADT 222 will be determined according to the following guidelines:
