other students in the class to contact the Judicial Affairs Office to seek a solution.

The Judicial Affairs Office suggests that an instructor address behavioral expectations at the very beginning of the class either through the syllabus, other written material or during the initial class instructions.

The instructor can also make general comments throughout the course concerning unacceptable behavior. It may be necessary to meet with a student individually to address behavior. However, the instructor should not meet with a student behind closed doors and should ask either the program coordinator or a judicial affairs representative to attend the meeting if he/she deems it necessary.

If the behavior continues, the instructor may ask the student to leave the class or in extreme cases be dropped from the course. If the student refuses to leave, the instructor can call public safety or for off-campus situations call 911.
