DOCUMENTATION OF SOURCES IN THE TEXT OF THE PAPER

If you quote from a source or use an idea taken from the work of someone else, you should note this in the text of your paper. All references used in the text should also appear in the list of works cited, and all references in the list of works cited should also appear in the text. Place the author's last name and the date of the work in parentheses after the material used. If there is no author identified, start with the title of the work.

The text would state: “Although some cultures and societies condone or even encourage abuse more than others, we must always guard against the cultural arrogance that says that one way is best for all children.” (Berger 2000).

The reference list would then state:
