Disclosure of Institutional (General Student Body) Graduation/Completion and Transfer-out Rates

The Community College of Baltimore County is pleased to provide following information regarding our institution's graduation/completion and transfer-out rates. The information is provided in compliance with the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended. The rates reflect the graduation, completion and transfer-out status of students who enrolled during the **2003-2004** school year and for whom 150% of the normal time-to-completion has elapsed.

During the fall semester of **2003**, **2,497** first-time, full-time, certificate or degree-seeking undergraduate students entered The Community College of Baltimore County. After 3 years (i.e., as of **August 31, 2006**), **10.2%** of these students had graduated from our institution or completed their programs and **12.9%** had transferred to other higher education institutions within the Maryland reporting system.

- Transfer data includes only the students who transferred to other higher education institutions within the Maryland reporting system.

- These charts do not identify the reasons why our students withdrew; therefore for personal or medical reasons are included.
- Graduation rates do not include students who left school to serve in the armed forces or on official church missions or with a foreign aid service of the federal government, or students who died or were totally and permanently disabled.
- A pound sign (#) denotes any cohort/subcohort with five or fewer students. The college is not required to disclose this information.
