**Who are CCBC Credit Students?
Spring 2012 Student Profiles
March 2012**

The attached tables provide enrollment and student demographics for Spring 2012 credit students at the Community College of Baltimore County. In addition to providing enrollment for CCBC, data are reported individually for CCBC course locations: Catonsville, Dundalk, Essex, Hunt Valley Center, Owings Mills Center, Randallstown (Liberty Center), and Off Campus locations. CCBC began offering credit courses at the Randallstown location in Fall 2011.

The last table (Table 9) provides enrollment information for students who were “New to CCBC” in Spring 2012. These new students have not previously enrolled in credit or CEED courses at CCBC, however, students new to CCBC may have previously taken courses at another college.

The enrollment information captured in this brief reflects data captured at the end of the third week (EOTW) for the Spring 2012 term.

Changes to Race Ethnicity Reporting

As of Fiscal Year 2011 CCBC is required to report race/ethnicity data according to new guidelines established by the federal government. Students are first asked to indicate whether they are Hispanic or Latino and then have the option to identify their race. Highlights

Table 1: CCBC

Provides an unduplicated count of credit students enrolled at CCBC in Spring 2012. Student demographic information is also provided.

- A total of 23,428 students enrolled in credit courses in Spring 2012
- Headcount decreased by 3% from Spring 2011
- Part-time students decreased by 4% while full-time students decreased 1%
- Male and female students decreased at the same rate (-3%)
- A little more than half of Spring 2012 students indicated their race to be Hispanic (4%), African-American (39%), Asian (6%), or Multi-Racial (2%)
- The majority of the Spring 2012 students were 29 years of age or less (69%)
- Almost three-fourths of the Spring 2012 students resided in Baltimore County

Table 2: Catonsville Campus:

Provides a profile of the students enrolled in at least one course at the Catonsville Campus; students may also be enrolled in courses at other CCBC locations.

- 10,552 students enrolled in at least one course on the Catonsville Campus in Spring 2012, a 1% decrease from the prior Spring term
- The number of full-time and part-time students decreased
- African-American students represented the largest percentage of students at Catonsville in Spring 2012 (46%); 40% of Catonsville students were White
- The largest age group at Catonsville continue to be 20-29 year olds (48% of all students)
- The number of first-time students enrolled in courses at Catonsville increased 7% in Spring 2012
- 70% of the students at Catonsville reside in Baltimore County

Table 3: Dundalk Campus:

Provides a profile of students enrolled in at least one course at the Dundalk Campus; students may also be enrolled in courses at other CCBC locations.

- 4,288 students enrolled in at least one course at the Dundalk Campus in Spring 2012; a 7% decrease from the previous Spring term
- 53% of Dundalk students were White while 36% were African-American
- 48% of Dundalk students were between 20 and 29 years of age in Spring 2012
- 76% of the students at Dundalk reside in Baltimore County

Table 4: Essex Campus:

Provides a profile of students enrolled in at least one course at the Essex Campus; students may also be enrolled in courses at other CCBC locations.

- 11,641 students enrolled in courses at the Essex Campus in Spring 2012
- White female students comprised the majority of the Essex population
- Most of Essex students are 29 years of age or younger
- 77% of the students at Essex reside in Baltimore County

Table 5: Hunt Valley Center:

Provides a profile of students enrolled in at least one course at the Hunt Valley Center; students may also be enrolled in courses at other CCBC locations.

- 461 students enrolled in at least one course at CCBC's Hunt Valley Center in Spring 2012; an 11% decrease from Spring 2011
- All students enrolled at the Hunt Valley Center took fewer than 12 credits.
- The majority of students enrolled at Hunt Valley are White
- Most HVC students are between the ages of 20-29
- 81% of the students at Hunt Valley reside in Baltimore County

Table 6: Owings Mills Center:

Provides a profile of students enrolled in at least one course at the Owings Mills Center; students may also be enrolled in courses at other CCBC locations.

- 1,199 students enrolled in at least one course at CCBC's Owings Mills Center in Spring 2012; this is a decrease of 6% from the previous Spring term
- 92% of student enrolled at Owings Mills attend part-time

- African-American students comprise the majority of students enrolled at the CCBC Owings Mills location
- 89% of the students at Owings Mills reside in Baltimore County

Table 7: Randallstown at the Liberty Center Location:

Provides a profile of students enrolled in at least one course at the Randallstown (Liberty Center) location; students may also be enrolled in courses at other CCBC locations.

- Beginning with Fall 2011 credit courses were offered at Randallstown Liberty Center
- 71 students enrolled in courses at Randallstown in Spring 2012
- 69% of the students were female
- 73% of the students were African-American
- The majority of students were 29 years of age or less
- 92% of Randallstown students reside in Baltimore County

Table 8: Off Campus Locations (locations other than CAT, DUN, ESS, HVC, OMC, and RAN):

Provides a profile of students enrolled in at least one course at an Off Campus location; students may also be enrolled in courses at other CCBC locations.

- 416 students enrolled in at least one Off Campus CCBC course in Spring 2012
- Off Campus enrollment decreased 41% from the previous Spring term; enrollment changes in Criminal Justice courses held Off campus is one explanation for the decrease from Spring 2011 to 2012
- White female students comprise the majority of the Off Campus students
- 60% of the Off Campus students are under 30 years of age
- 57% of Off Campus students reside in Baltimore County

Table 9: New to CCBC Student Enrollment

Provides a profile of students enrolled for the first time at CCBC; New to CCBC students have not enrolled in credit or CEED courses at CCBC prior to the current term. These students may have previously enrolled at another institution.

- 2,735 New students enrolled at CCBC in Spring 2012; a 3% decrease from the previous Spring term
- The majority of New students enrolled part-time
- 45% of New students were African-American a 6% increase over Spring 2011; there was also an increase in the number of Hispanic, Asian, Native Hawaiian, and Multi-Racial New students; White students decreased 12%
- Most New students were between the ages of 20 and 29 (48% of all New students)
- Although Baltimore County residents comprise the largest segment of the New student population in Spring 2012, the New out-of-county, New out-of-state and International student populations all experienced a slight increase from the previous Spring term
