

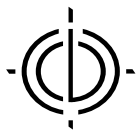

Thank you for your interest in a program in the School of Health Professions at the Community College of Baltimore County. This is the application form to apply for admission to any of the nursing programs in the School of Health Professions. Please read ALL of the instructions and information carefully to prevent delays in the processing of your application. **Do not hesitate to call the Office of Selective Admissions if you have any questions about the application process, phone 410-780-6112.**

The information contained in this application is as accurate as possible at the time of printing. It is the applicant's responsibility to check for changes to program requirements by contacting either the program director or the Office of Selective Admissions.

School of Health Professions Policies

Honor Code

All students enrolled in any program in the School of Health Professions will be required to sign, and conduct themselves according to, an honor code.

Professional Behavior

The School of Health Professions requires that all students will conduct themselves in a professional manner as described in the SHP policy manual or individual program handbook.

Criminal Background Checks

Students who are accepted into any of the SHP programs will be required to participate in a criminal background check. The student will pay for the background check and may be asked to provide a copy of the results to clinical sites. **Applicants are hereby notified that many state and national certification agencies will not grant a license or certification to students who have positive findings in their background checks.**

Drug Testing

Students who are accepted into any of the SHP programs are hereby notified that they will be required to participate in random urine drug testing prior to beginning program courses. Random urine drug testing may be required at any time during the program.

Health Insurance/Immunizations

All students enrolled in all SHP programs are required to provide proof of current immunizations and to maintain health insurance coverage throughout the duration of the program.

Blood Borne Pathogens Notification

Notice is given to all prospective students that there is a potential for exposure to infectious agents through contact with blood and body fluids in every program in the School of Health Professions.

Communications Skills

All students enrolled in all SHP programs are required to demonstrate proficiency in written and spoken English as described in the SHP policy manual.

Professional/Technical Standards and Students with Disabilities

Each program publishes its own essential functions and professional technical standards pertinent to the practice of that profession. Students having a documented disability who feel they can perform according to the program's technical standards, but may need reasonable accommodations should contact the CCBC Office of Special Services before the start of the program or as soon as possible thereafter. Reasonable accommodations will be made for any student with a documented disability through the Office of Special Services.

Admissions Process for the CCBC School of Health Professions, Programs OTHER THAN Nursing

1. **First, apply for admission to the College.** Submit the application for admission to CCBC and the \$15.00 application fee to the Office of the Bursar, and official copies of any external transcripts to the Office of Records and Registration for evaluation. All international transcripts must be evaluated by an agency such as the American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (AACRAO). The CCBC application is available on all campuses and online at www.ccbcmd.edu.
2. **See a case manager.**

3. **Participate in assessment testing, if necessary.**
4. **Enroll** in any required developmental courses, and in prerequisites and general education courses for your program. In order to be eligible to apply for admission to any of the credit programs in the School of Health Professions, the minimum acceptable overall CCBC GPA is 2.00.
5. **Apply to the program.** Deliver or mail the Selective Admissions Application and the additional \$15.00 non-refundable application fee to the Office of the Bursar on any campus. Application deadlines are listed on the back of this form.
The application is available at www.ccbcmd.edu/allied_health or by calling 410-780-6989.
6. **Submit required paperwork to the Office of Selective Admissions.** This includes all external transcripts, CLEP scores, Advanced Placement scores, evaluations of international transcripts, reference letters, and proof of state certifications as required for some programs. **Even if you have previously submitted external transcripts to Records and Registration at any CCBC campus, you must still submit separate transcripts to the Office of Selective Admissions on the Essex campus by the application deadline. It is the applicant's responsibility to determine that the Office of Selective Admissions has all of the required grades and transcripts.**
7. If admission to your program includes an interview, applicants who are eligible for an interview will be contacted by letter.
8. Approximately 4 to 6 weeks after the application deadline, all applicants will receive a letter informing them of the status of their applications.
9. If you are not successful in your petition for admission and intend to reapply, you must submit a new application for the next admission cycle. You must pay the application fee each time you apply for admission.
