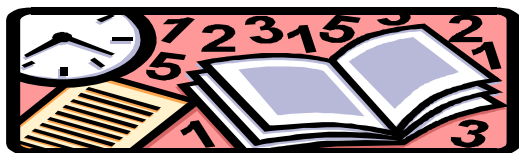

#### *Spotlight Speaker Series*

*William Rhoden, Journalist, Sportswriter and Author of Forty Million Dollar Slaves*

*Topic: Forty Million Dollar Slaves: The Rise, Fall and Redemption of the Black Athlete*

Rhoden has been a sportswriter for *The New York Times* since 1983, and has written the "Sports of The Times" column for more than a decade. Prior to that, he was associate editor of *Ebony* magazine from 1974 to 1978, and later spent more than three years with *The Baltimore Sun* as a columnist and jazz critic. He was a consultant and guest on *ESPN's Sports Century Series*, and has been a staple on the award-winning show, *Sports Reporters*, for 14 years.

Rhoden released his first book in July 2006 titled, Forty Million Dollar Slaves, a political and cultural analysis of African American athletes including the history making accomplishments of notable figures such as Jesse Owens, Althea Gibson, and Willie Mays.
