SIGNIFICANT ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

- Nine high schools participated in early testing this year, with approximately 600 new students being tested. Approximately 200 of the 270 students who were assessed during year 1 of the pilot were tested to provide test/retest data.
- College Board provided 1000 test units to support the Early Assessment project.
- Faculty from the Essex campus worked with English faculty from Chesapeake High School (E-CISL funded) to create a more seamless English curriculum.
- An intensive non-credit math workshop was offered to 12th grade math students at Chesapeake High School (E-CISL funded).
- A joint meeting occurred between CCBC and personnel from the BCPS system to celebrate progress of the Early Intervention program and to discuss future initiatives.
- A developmental learning community with students from Dundalk High School occurred this spring.
- Plans are underway for many seniors from Sparrows Point and Dundalk High Schools to enroll as PEP students in credit courses at the Dundalk campus next year.
- A joint funding proposal from CCBC and BCPS has been written and submitted to the county to support the early intervention initiative.
- A data management system has been created to allow us to track outcomes for this program.
