Community College of Baltimore County and Towson University

The option for students to begin university courses in their first year of nursing at CCBC.

General Information for this Face-to-Face, Online, or Combination Model*

*NEW for fall 2019 – Towson University is offering students the opportunity to choose the format for each course that works best for them.

I. General Program Information

This dual enrollment option is available to eligible students once they are accepted to the CCBC Nursing Program. Admission is competitive and based on completed courses and grade point average (GPA). Students will be enrolled as degree students at CCBC and TU and begin to take TU courses during the Nursing Program at CCBC. Once the Associate of Science (A.S.) Degree is awarded at CCBC, students must take and pass the nursing licensure exam, the NCLEX-RN, and then continue coursework at TU to complete the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) Degree.

Program length is 9 terms, including winter and summer sessions, and it takes approximately 2 ½ years to complete.

CCBC courses will be held at the CCBC Essex or Catonsville campuses (campus where student was accepted to Nursing). TU face-to-face courses/designated classes will be taken at the Towson campus.

Two degrees will be awarded: A.S. from CCBC and B.S. from TU (where a minimum of **30 credits** will be required from TU to graduate). Advisors will be available from both CCBC and TU. Financial aid will be arranged through the Towson University Office of Financial Aid.

II. Program Admission Requirements

- A. Admission to the CCBC Nursing Program (selective process based on courses completed, GPA, and TEAS score)
- B. GPA of 3.0 or higher in CCBC required admission courses
- C. Additional required courses (completed by the start of the first nursing course) with a C or better:
 - Chemistry (CHEM 107/108) 4 credits (must include a lab)
 - Statistics (MATH 153) 3-4 credits
 - Nutrition (BIOL 256) 3 credits

III. ATB Program Progression

Students must be successful in all required courses to continue in the ATB option. Students are expected to complete the sequence of study as outlined in the Towson Univ. ATB curriculum plan. Students are required to meet regularly with their TU advisor to review their ATB curriculum plan. Students must successfully complete their associate degree prior to taking NURS 476 and NURS 484. Students must successfully pass the NCLEX-RN exam prior to taking NURS 489 (Practicum).

IV. General Application Procedures

Note: Students applying to the TU ATB Option must also apply to the CCBC A.S. Degree Nursing Program.

Admission to the TU Option is contingent upon admission to CCBC's Nursing Program.

All TU applications, fees and transcripts must be received by TU by the deadline of January 31 for a fall start OR by August 15 for a spring start.

1. Complete the online Department of Nursing Application for Admission: ATB (<https://www.towson.edu/chp/departments/nursing/undergrad/degree-options/associate-to-bs/admissions.html>)
2. Pay the \$50 application fee (non-refundable).
3. Submit official hardcopy or electronic transcripts from all colleges or universities attended. All official transcripts must be received by University Admissions by application deadline. Hardcopy transcripts should be sent directly to:

4. CCBC and TU Nursing Departments will review for acceptance into the ATB option.
5. Student will be notified by either email and/or letter with admission decision.
