

**Transfer Plan**  
**Community College of Baltimore County**  
**Associate of Arts in Humanities and Social Sciences Area of Concentration Sports Management to American Public University Bachelor of Arts Sports Management**

1. Students in and graduates of the Associate of Arts degree in Sports Management at Institution that apply to APUS and satisfy all APUS admission requirements may be admitted to APUS (“APUS Students”). APUS Students will receive transfer credit for those specific Institution courses (each a “Course”) as set forth in the Course Equivalency table below.
2. The number of credits transferred may not exceed 90 credit hours, which contribute to the fulfillment of credit hours required for Bachelor of Arts degree in Sports Management completion at APUS.
3. An Institution student must earn a grade of “C” (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) or better in each Institution course for which the student desires transfer credits from APUS.
4. The maximum number of credits that will be accepted by APUS toward degree requirements from non-direct classroom instruction (including CLEP, AP, and other nationally recognized standardized examination scores) is based on annually published national scores with recommended credits. Credit awarded for prior learning assessments (“PLA”) is not recognized by APUS without verification through the APUS PLA process.

### Remaining Courses

### Additional Provisions

1. Per APUS' General Education Block policy, students with a conferred Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree from a regionally-accredited higher education institution will be awarded transfer credit for APUS' General Education requirements (excluding Required). As the amount of transfer credit may not

exceed the sum of transferrable credit the student earned, the amount of transfer credit applicable to the Electives will be reduced by the sum of General Education Block credit awarded.

2. Credit variances in academic placement and credit award can occur based on student course selections and APUS' program requirements.
3. Any transferable course not used to fulfill General Education or Major/Concentration requirements may be taken. Please note remedial/developmental and vocational credit is not transferrable
