

CCBC FAMILY LITERACY ESOL PROGRAM FALL 2025



Want to learn English and learn about your children's school? The Family Literacy ESOL program is for non-native speaking parents. These classes are designed to help parents learn English language skills for life, work and to help with their child's education.

ELIGIBILITY

You must have a child aged 0-16 living in your home who is either attending a Baltimore County Public School, a partner private school, or the Judy Center of Baltimore County. You also must be at least 18 years old and not enrolled in or planning to attend high school. F-1 or J-1 visa holders are not eligible.

COST

No cost for class. Grant-funded.*

You will need to purchase a student textbook and workbook set, available at any CCBC campus bookstore.
