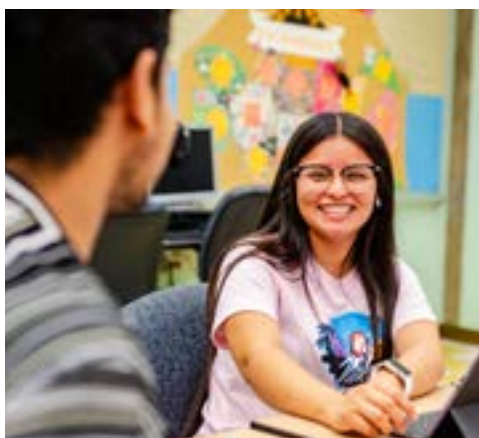

Want to learn English? Adult and Family Literacy offers an English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) Beginning Life Skills and Intermediate Civics program at CCBC. These classes help students learn English language skills for life, work and civics.

ELIGIBILITY

Students must be at least 18 years of age and not enrolled or planning to attend high school to register. Students with an F-1 or J-1 Visa are not eligible for LABOR grant funded* classes.

COST

No cost for class. Grant-funded.*

You will need to purchase a student textbook and workbook at any CCBC campus bookstore.

CLASS SCHEDULE AND SUPPLIES

- Online (Zoom) classes require a computer with a camera, microphone and unlimited internet.
- For online (Zoom) classes, students must attend a CCBC campus on the last class day to take a test.

- Arrive on time; it's first-come, first-served and may take 2-3 hours.
