



Radiography Program Effectiveness Data

Program mission:

The mission of the Community College of Baltimore County's Radiography Program is to prepare qualified students to become proficient diagnostic medical radiographers and integral members of the healthcare team. By offering a thoughtfully designed curriculum that leverages CCBC's resources and clinical sites, we provide students with a robust education grounded in liberal arts and sciences. Our program aligns with the college's broader mission by cultivating healthcare professionals who will stay in the area as productive citizens, actively enhance public health, and commit to lifelong learning.

Program goals:

1. Students will be clinically competent.
2. Students will use critical thinking skills.
3. Students will communicate effectively.
4. Students will evaluate the need for professionalism.
5. The program will constantly measure its effectiveness in graduating entry-level technologists.

Learning outcomes:

1. Students will demonstrate positioning skills.
2. Students will select appropriate technical factors.
3. Students will demonstrate knowledge of and practice radiation safety.
4. Students will manipulate technical factors for non-routine examinations (i.e.: portables/ or/trauma/ pediatrics).
5. Students will evaluate images.
6. Students will demonstrate effective written communication skills.
7. Students will use effective oral communication skills.
8. Students will demonstrate professional behavior.
9. Students will understand professional ethics.
10. Competent students will complete the program.
11. Graduates will pass the ARRT Registry certification on the 1st attempt.
12. Students will score at or above the national average on the ARRT Radiography Exam.
13. Employers will be satisfied with educational preparedness of graduates.
14. Students will express satisfaction with the radiography program, with answers of Good or better.
15. Of those seeking employment, graduates will obtain employment.



Accreditation information:

The Community College of Baltimore County (CCBC) Radiography Program is accredited by the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology (JRCERT). The program has a full 8-year accreditation with the next review date in November 2030. CCBC is regionally accredited through the Middle States Commission on Higher Education. 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Five-year average credentialing examination (American Registry of Radiologic Technologists Radiography exam) pass rate of not less than 75 percent at first attempt within six months of graduation.

The JRCERT has defined “**not actively seeking employment**” as:

- 1) Graduate fails to communicate with program officials regarding employment status after multiple attempts **OR**
- 2) Graduate is unwilling to seek employment that requires relocation, **OR**
- 3) Graduate is unwilling to accept employment due to salary or hours, **OR**
- 4) Graduate is on active military duty, **OR**
- 5) Graduate is continuing education.

Program completion rate

Program completion rate is defined as the measurement of the number of students that began the program divided by the number of students that actually completed the program.*
