

**ACADEMIC PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BOARD
OF TRUSTEES OF THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF BALTIMORE COUNTY
AND
FROSTBURG STATE UNIVERSITY REGARDING TRANSFER FROM A.A.S.,
KINESIOLOGY TO B.S., EXERCISE AND SPORT SCIENCE**

This Academic Program Articulation Agreement (“Agreement”) is entered into by and between The Board of Trustees of the Community College of Baltimore County an institution of higher education, organized in the State of Maryland with a campus located at 7201 Rossville Boulevard, Baltimore, MD 21237 (the “Sending Institution”) and Frostburg State University institution of higher education, organized in the State of Maryland with its principal office located at 101 Braddock Road, Frostburg, MD, 21532 (the “Receiving Institution”) (collectively, the “Institutions”) to facilitate the transfer of academic credits from the A.A.S. degree in Kinesiology (CIP: 310505; HEGIS 529900) for the completion of the B.S. degree in Exercise and Sport Science (CIP: 310505; HEGIS: 83502)

A. Qualifying Students

This Agreement pertains to the transfer of “Qualifying Students”, *i.e.*, those students who:

1. Have successfully completed the program at the Sending Institution.
2. Are enrolled in the Sending Institution, in good standing.
3. Are accepted for admission to the Receiving Institution.
4. Have earned a C grade or better in core EXSS courses.

B. Responsibilities of the Institutions

The Institutions agree to implement the transfer of Qualifying Students in accordance with applicable law and the following requirements and protocols:

1. A Qualifying Student may transfer into from the Transferring Institution into the Receiving Institution for the completion of the Program.
2. Courses that the Receiving School will accept credits KNLS towards completion of the Program include:

4. If the Qualifying Student is using federal Title 38 VA Education Benefits (GI Bill® Education Benefits), the Institutions shall adhere to all applicable U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs' regulations, including the regulations governing the awarding prior credit, as regulated under Title 38, Code of Federal Regulations, Sections 21.4253(d)(3) and 21.4254(c)(4).
5. Each Institution shall adhere to all applicable transfer requirements set forth in the Annotated Code of Maryland and the Code of Maryland Regulations.
6. Each Institution shall advise students regarding transfer opportunities under this Agreement, and shall advise students of financial aid opportunities and implications associated with the transfer.
7. Should either Institution make changes to program requirements, the institution will inform the partner institution immediately. The articulation agreement should be updated to reflect the changes and forwarded to the Maryland Higher Education Commission.

C. FERPA Compliance and Data Sharing

1. The Institutions acknowledge that the transfer of students under this Agreement may require the sharing of personally identifiable information from education records in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), 20 U.S.C. § 1232g and 34 C.F.R. Part 99.
2. Each Institution agrees to obtain and maintain appropriate written consent from students, or rely on applicable exceptions under FERPA, to disclose education records, including transcripts, academic performance, and enrollment status to the partner Institution for the purposes of transfer evaluation, academic advising, financial aid coordination, and program tracking.
3. Students participating in this Agreement may be asked to sign a bi-directional FERPA release authorizing both Institutions to share such records as necessary to facilitate transfer and degree completion.
4. The Institutions further agree that the execution and implementation of this Agreement will be accompanied by the executed CCBC Data Sharing Addendum, which governs the scope, safeguarding, and permitted uses of shared data. In the event of a conflict between the Agreement and the CCBC Data Sharing Addendum with respect to data handling or FERPA compliance, the Addendum shall control.

D. Term and Termination

1. This Agreement shall become effective on the date that it is signed by the appropriate and authorized representatives of each Institution and shall remain in effect for a period of three (3) years, unless earlier terminated pursuant to this section.

2. Either Institution may, at its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement upon delivering ninety (90) days written notice to the other Institution and the Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC).
3. Both Institutions agree to review the terms of this Agreement prior to its expiration to ensure alignment with MHEC requirements and institutional policies.
4. This Agreement may be renewed for additional periods upon mutual written agreement of both Institutions.

E. Amendment

1. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement of the Institutions with respect to their rights and obligations in carrying out the terms of the Agreement and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous agreements or understandings.
2. This Agreement may be modified only by written amendment executed by both Institutions. Any curriculum modifications that affect the course equivalencies or program structure shall be communicated in writing and reflected in an updated course matrix as a part of the amendment process.

F. Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of Maryland.

G. Counterparts

This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which, taken together, shall constitute one and the same agreement.

H. Notice of Agreement

1. The Institutions agree to provide a copy of this Agreement, with any amendments, to the Maryland Higher Education Commission.
2. The Institutions agree to provide copies of this Agreement to all relevant individuals and departments of the Institutions, including but not limited to students, academic department chairs participating in the transfer, offices of the president, registrar's offices, and financial aid offices.

I. No Third-Party Beneficiaries

There are no third-party beneficiaries to this Agreement.

J. Representations and Warranties of the Parties

Both Institutions represent and warrant that the following shall be true and correct as of the Effective Date of this Agreement, and shall continue to be true and correct during the term of this Agreement:

1. The Institutions are and shall remain in compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local statutes, laws, ordinances, and regulations relating to this Agreement, as amended from time to time.
2. That the individual signing this Agreement on its behalf is duly authorized to do so and that the Agreement constitutes a binding obligation of the Institution.
