Practicum II: Quality Management and Performance Improvement

Description

HIIT 271 – Practicum II: Quality Management and Performance Improvement provides students with 30 hours' practice abstracting and retrieving health data, interpreting data, and presenting data through a supervised and outcomes-based work experience in a management setting of a healthcare facility. Students identify trends in data that affect quality management and participate in performance improvement planning initiatives.

1 Credit: 1 lecture hour; 2 lab hours

Prerequisites: HIIT 171, HIIT 220, HIIT 221, CSIT 241, and approval of program coordinator

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course students will be able to:

1. compile data and perform data quality reviews;
2. abstract and report data for facility management and performance improvement;
3. develop reports on audit findings;
4. apply current laws, accreditation licensure, and certification standards related to health information initiatives from national, state, local, and facility levels;
5. apply and promote ethical standards of practice;
6. apply confidentiality and security measures to protect health information;
7. utilize technology to collect, store, analyze, and report data;
8. apply knowledge of database architecture and design;
9. protect data integrity and validity;
10. participate in work teams and on committees;
11. contribute to work plans, policies and procedures, and resource acquisition;
12. utilize tools and techniques to monitor, report on, and improve processes;
13. evaluate the revenue cycle management process; and
14. review standards for national registry exam.
