Description

INTR 119 – Ethical Decisions in Interpreting guides students through a critical analysis of ethics and ethical decision making in the field of sign language interpreting through a social justice framework. Ethical dilemmas are analyzed in a variety of specialized settings and through various stakeholder perspectives.

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course students will be able to:

1. define ethical conflicts in various interpreted settings;
2. classify conflict type when presented with various ethical dilemmas;
3. identify ethical conflicts in interpreting when presented with a case;
4. utilize frameworks for case analysis;
5. discuss ethical dilemmas articulately using appropriate terminology;
6. reframe an ethical conflict from multiple stakeholder viewpoints;
7. assess an ethical dilemma from multiple stakeholder viewpoints;
8. analyze a case independently and collaboratively with student interpreter peers;
9. assess an interpreter's ethical decision as compared to their own identity, values, beliefs, power and privilege; and
10. justify an interpreter's ethical decision utilizing the Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf Code of Professional Conduct.
