MUSA 213

Applied Classical Organ III 1 or 2 Credits

Description

MUSA 213 – 1 or 2 credits – Applied Classical Organ III provides individual instruction in organ. This course is recommended for students who have had significant previous experience in music. An initial placement audition is required. There is an additional fee for all Applied Music (MUSA) courses. Please check the class schedule for more information. Music majors are also required to attend *Music Forum*, held each Friday of the semester at 12:20 p.m., and a weekly organ repertoire class. Lesson times are arranged with individual instructors.

1 or 2 Credits

Prerequisite: MUSA 113 or written Music Program authorization.

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course students will be able to:

- 1. perform advanced intermediate classical repertoire for organ as selected by the instructor;
- 2. perform a mandatory jury examination for the instructor and a panel of music instructors in which the following are demonstrated at the appropriate level:
 - use of stops
 - phrasing
 - rhythm
 - stylistic understanding
 - musical sensitivity; and
- 3. demonstrate an advanced intermediate level of technical proficiency in the performance of studies, exercises, scales, and repertoire as assigned by the instructor.

Major Topics

- I. Technical fundamentals of organ playing
 - a. body position
 - b. arm, wrist, hand, and finger position
 - c. use of the feet
 - d. fingering
 - e. use of stops
- II. Expressive nuances of organ playing
 - a. phrasing
 - b. articulation
 - c. dynamics
 - d. stylistic interpretation

- e. choice of stops
- III. Listening and score study assignments related to works being studied
- IV. Effective preparation for weekly lessons, repertoire classes, and final juried performance

Course Requirements

<u>Grading/exams</u>: Grading procedures will be determined by the individual faculty member but will include the following:

- 1. Regular and punctual attendance at weekly private lessons and repertoire classes.
- 2. Effective use of individual practice time as evaluated by the instructor.
- 3. Weekly evaluation/critique of performance proficiency and musical growth.
- 4. *Music Forum* attendance.
- 5. Final juried performance evaluation.
