Description

Intermediate Bowling

Provides further practice and skills for the student who has completed the beginning course, has had formal instruction, or has interscholastic or intercollegiate varsity experience. Requires an ability to explain the spot bowling technique, to keep score and to use bowling terminology. Offered at an off-campus site.

Prerequisite: Consent of instructor or demonstration of the following skills: pendulum arm swing approach and release with good form and ability to score a complete game.

Overall Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

1. Demonstrate the basic pendulum arm swing.
2. Demonstrate the hook and straight ball delivering paths.
3. Demonstrate the “spare marker” spare conversion system.
4. Score a complete game.
5. Calculate his/her personal average.
6. Analyze the difference between the types of flooring used at different bowling centers.
7. Understand the basic concept used to purchase a 10-pin bowling ball.

Major Topics

1. History and etiquette of 10 pin bowling.
2. Equipment selection.
3. Scoring and handicapping.
4. Spot bowling techniques.
5. Strike marker system.
6. Concept of league bowling.
