



Radiography Program Effectiveness Data

Program mission:

The mission of the Community College of Baltimore County Radiography Program is to prepare qualified students to be competent diagnostic medical radiographers. This is accomplished primarily by providing a carefully designed curriculum that uses the resources of CCBC and the Program's clinical sites to provide students with a foundation of higher education based on the liberal arts and sciences. Secondly, the Program compliments the overall college campus mission by educating health care providers who will remain in the area as productive working citizens and directly contribute to the betterment of the public health of the community.

Program goals:

1. Students will be clinically competent.
2. Students will use critical thinking skills.
3. Students will communicate effectively.
4. Students will evaluate the need for professionalism.
5. The program will constantly measure its effectiveness in graduating entry-level technologists.

Learning outcomes:

1. Demonstrate positioning skills and clinical competences by selecting appropriate technical factors, demonstrating knowledge of and practicing radiation safety, demonstrating effective patient care practices, and evaluating and critiquing radiographic images,
2. Demonstrate effective written and oral communication skills,
3. Demonstrate and apply concepts of professional behavior and ethics,
4. Complete the radiography program and the requirements for the Associate in Applied Science degree,
5. Pass the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) certification exam on the first attempt with scoring at or above the national average on the ARRT certification exam, and
6. Will obtain employment in the radiologic/medical imaging field within twelve months of graduation.



Accreditation information:

The Community College of Baltimore County (CCBC) Radiography Program is accredited by the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology (JRCERT). The program has a full 8-year accreditation with the next review date in October 2022. CCBC is regionally accredited through the Middle States Commission on Higher Education. The JRCERT has defined “**not actively seeking employment**” as:

- 1) Graduate fails to communicate with program officials regarding employment status after multiple attempts **OR**
- 2) Graduate is unwilling to seek employment that requires relocation, **OR**
- 3) Graduate is unwilling to accept employment due to salary or hours, **OR**
- 4) Graduate is on active military duty, **OR**
- 5) Graduate is continuing education.

Program completion rate

Program completion rate is defined as the measurement of the number of students that began the program divided by the number of students that actually completed the program.*
