

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Community College of Baltimore County (hereafter referred to as CCBC), a community college in Baltimore County, Maryland, and Goucher College (hereafter referred to as Goucher), a private liberal arts college in Towson, Maryland, agree to offer an articulated program leading to the award of a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology.

PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

This agreement is entered into in the interests of our students. The general purpose of this agreement is to make clear the terms of this articulation agreement. This agreement will allow for the efficient transfer of students between campuses, including transfer credit, admissions, and financial aid/scholarship. It will provide opportunities for students beyond the classroom, serving as a basis for student involvement and faculty interaction. It will set expectations for administrators, faculty, and staff at both institutions and foster a working relationship between the parties. Finally, it will encourage students to continue their education for their personal and professional development.

ADMINISTRATIVE PRINCIPLES

The following general principles guide the operation of this Agreement:

1. The program is designed for graduates/transfers of the Associate of Arts in Humanities and Social Science Area of Concentration in Psychology at CCBC. A maximum of sixty (60) transfer credit hours from CCBC will be allowed towards fulfillment of the minimum one hundred and twenty (120) credit hours required for completion of Bachelor of Arts degree (Psychology).

Courses approved by Goucher College from CCBC can be used to fulfill the Goucher Commons Requirements (GCRs). Students will likely have to complete some of the GCRs through Goucher College (ex. Study Abroad requirement). Goucher College will evaluate the individual student's coursework and let them know how it applies towards the GCRs.

2. The maximum number of transfer credits that will be accepted by Goucher College toward degree requirements is sixty (60) credits. These include transfer credits from: regionally approved not for profit colleges and universities; specified Advanced Placement exams; International Baccalaureate, German Abitur, and General Certificate of Education A-Level. If the course is evaluated by CCBC and applied to the Associate of Applied Science transfer degree, the student must submit an official transcript to Goucher College. Goucher College will then evaluate the coursework for possible transfer credit.. It is possible that not all courses taken at CCBC will be approved for transfer credit by Goucher College.
3. Courses completed at another community college or four-year institution will count towards the total credits transferred into Goucher. Official transcripts from all previously attended institutions will also be required.

4. Once the Associate of Arts degree is completed and the student has been admitted to Goucher, the student will be instructed to contact the appointed academic advisor and register for classes.
5. Students may complete the Goucher curriculum part-time or full-time, face-to-face.
6. This articulation agreement becomes effective on the date set forth on the first page of this document. This agreement will be reviewed and re-signed every two (2) years.
7. CCBC will permit Goucher to conduct on-campus information sessions at locations and on dates that are mutually agreeable.
8. CCBC will provide appropriate accommodations for the Goucher recruiter to meet with students in a confidential environment. Prior notice will be required.
9. CCBC will allow Goucher to distribute or place materials at campus information distribution points that will be mutually agreeable to both parties (e.g. kiosks, central information desks, bulletin boards, etc.).
10. CCBC and Goucher agree to monitor the performance of this agreement and to revise it as necessary.
11. The agreement may be terminated by either party after adequate notice, defined as one calendar year, at which time appropriate measures will be put into place regarding the continued transfer of students.
12. The office of record for program articulation agreements at Goucher College is the Provost's Office. The office of record at Community College of Baltimore County is the Office of Instruction.

For students following this agreement, the requirements listed below apply:

1. Students must reach out to the CCBC Psychology Program Chair or Coordinator to fill out a Substitution/Wavier Form in order to graduate using this articulation agreement.
2. Students must maintain a 2.0 cumulative grade point average in order to transfer to Goucher. Should students choose to transfer prior to completion of the associate's degree, they will be responsible for meeting Goucher eligibility requirements.
3. Goucher University does not guarantee the transferability of courses taken outside the guidelines within this articulated agreement.
4. In order to be eligible for admission, students must comply with all Goucher admissions requirements, including posted deadlines and submission of appropriate documentation.
5. Should this articulation agreement concern a program with additional admissions requirements or prerequisite coursework, students must have met all standards prior to enrollment at Goucher.
6. Students shall apply for admission to Goucher College, indicating Psychology as the intended major using the common application at <https://www.goucher.edu/become/apply/transfer-students/>.
7. Students will automatically be nominated for scholarships for which they are eligible.
8. Students shall contact the Transfer Coordinator for their major for an advisement appointment once they have been admitted to Goucher. The required credit hours must be successfully completed before Goucher College can grant the degree. Each student's last sixty (60) credit hours must be completed at Goucher.

APPENDICES

As part of this agreement, the following have been included:

1. Course-by-course articulations, including satisfaction of general education requirements at both Community College of Baltimore County and Goucher University.
2. Upper division requirements to be completed at Goucher University.

These appendices may be changed, by mutual agreement, after adequate notice, defined as one calendar year, without the procedural process review or revision of the entire articulation agreement.

***College Writing Proficiency**

College Writing Proficiency (CWP) is a requirement for graduation from Goucher College. The achievement of CWP signifies that students can craft a sophisticated argument, conduct modern scholarly research, and write clearly and gracefully.

Students must reach out to the CCBC Psychology Program Chair or Coordinator to fill out a Substitution/Wavier Form in order to graduate using this articulation agreement.

Transfer students who have taken a college writing course at another institution and who would like to modify their writing sequence, may submit a portfolio of academic writing to the Director of the Writing Program, who will offer individual guidance. These portfolios should be submitted during the summer/semester before the student enters Goucher. Students may use their CCBC writings papers.

APPENDIX II-A: UPPER DIVISION REQUIREMENTS

Psychology (Catalog 2018-2020)

All transfer students will be required to take a minimum of 60 credits of upper division coursework at Goucher. A minimum total of 120 credits are required for the degree.

Completion of the B.A. degree program in Psychology requires students to successfully complete the following course work:
