

**ACADEMIC PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF BALTIMORE COUNTY AND  
GOUCHER COLLEGE REGARDING TRANSFER FROM THE ASSOCIATE OF ARTS  
IN HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES SOCIOLOGY AREA OF  
CONCENTRATION TO THE BACHELOR OF ARTS IN  
SOCIOLOGY/ANTHROPOLOGY**

This Academic Program Articulation Agreement (“Agreement”) is entered into by and between **Community College of Baltimore County** (the “Sending Institution”) and Goucher College the “Receiving Institution”) (collectively, the “Institutions”) to facilitate the transfer of academic credits from the **Associate of Arts in Humanities and Social Sciences, Sociology Area of Concentration (AOC)** for the completion of the **Bachelor of Arts in Sociology/Anthropology** (the “Program(s)”).

#### A. Qualifying Students

This Agreement pertains to the transfer of “Qualifying Students”, *i.e.*, those students who:

1. Have successfully completed the program at the Sending Institution;
2. Are enrolled in the Sending Institution, in good standing; and
3. Are accepted for admission to the Receiving Institution

#### B. Responsibilities of the Institutions

The Institutions agree to implement the transfer of Qualifying Students in accordance with applicable law and the following requirements and protocols:

1. A Qualifying Student may transfer into from the Transferring Institution into the Receiving Institution for the completion of the Program.
2. Courses that the Receiving School will accept credits for towards completion of the Program include:

\*\*\* College Writing Proficiency (CWP) – transfer students must submit a portfolio of academic writing to the Director of the Writing Program. Students should be advised to retain two academic papers, for a total of ten pages of academic writing for submittal to the director.

Transfer students are exempt from the First Year Seminar.

### Remaining Courses

Students will take the following courses at Goucher College to meet their graduation requirements. Students who transfer before completing the **Associate of Arts in Humanities and Social Sciences, Sociology Area of Concentration** may have additional program and graduation requirements to take and fewer free electives.

- Students will need to complete a Data Analytics through the curriculum course=4 credits
- Environmental Studies requirement if ENV5 101 is not completed at CCBC =4 credits
- RPP last year experience
- Foreign Language Course/s Requirement=4-10 credits depending on results of language placement exam
- Study Abroad requirement=4 credits
- Students who earn an Associate’s Degree in Arts or Sciences are exempt from the Complex Problem Exploration Course Requirement

### Major Requirements

All transfer students will be required to take a minimum of **60** credits of coursework at Goucher College. A minimum total of **120** credits are required for the degree.

#### 3. Additional Provisions

- Courses that fulfill program requirements are only eligible for transfer if students have earned a grade of “C-” or better. Courses used to fulfill only general education requirements are eligible for transfer if students have earned a grade of “C-” or better.
- Students must maintain a (a 2.5) cumulative grade point average in order to transfer.

- Students intending to transfer should complete the admission application for Goucher College following the third semester of their Associate Degree program.

5. If the Qualifying Student is using federal Title 38 VA Education Benefits (GI Bill® Education Benefits), the Institutions shall adhere to all applicable U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs’ regulations, including the regulations governing the awarding prior credit, as regulated under Title 38, Code of Federal Regulations, Sections 21.4253(d)(3) and 21.4254(c)(4).
6. Each Institution shall adhere to all applicable transfer requirements set forth in the Annotated Code of Maryland and the Code of Maryland Regulations.
7. Each Institution shall advise students regarding transfer opportunities under this Agreement, and shall advise students of financial aid opportunities and implications associated with the transfer.

**C. Term and Termination**

1. This agreement shall be effective on the date that it is signed by the appropriate and authorized representatives of each Institution.
2. Either Institution may, at its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement upon delivering 60 days written notice to the other Institution.
3. Both Institutions agree to meet once every **2 year(s)** to review the terms of this agreement, and renew or apply edits in written correspondence, copied to each party referenced in this document.

#### D. Amendment

1. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement of the Institutions with respect to their rights and obligations in carrying out the terms of the Agreement, and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous agreements or understandings.
2. This Agreement may be modified only by written amendment executed by both Institutions.

#### E. Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of Maryland.

#### F. Counterparts

This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which, taken together, shall constitute one and the same agreement.

#### G. Notice of Agreement

1. The Institutions agree to provide copies of this Agreement to all relevant individuals and departments of the Institutions, including but not limited to students, academic department chairs participating in the transfer, offices of the president, registrar's offices, and financial aid offices.

#### H. No Third-Party Beneficiaries

There are no third-party beneficiaries to this Agreement.

#### I. Representations and Warranties of the Parties

Both Institutions represent and warrant that the following shall be true and correct as of the Effective Date of this Agreement, and shall continue to be true and correct during the term of this Agreement:

1. The Institutions are and shall remain in compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local statutes, laws, ordinances, and regulations relating to this Agreement, as amended from time to time.
2. Each Institution has taken all action necessary for the approval and execution of this Agreement.
